
END OF SUMMER LUAAU

Libraries Rocks!

Remember to bring your summer reading sheets back to the Library to redeem for prizes by August 4th. Prizes are only available while supplies last and cannot be exchanged.

Thank you to all of our patrons for your patience as the community continues to grow. The library has found itself getting busier every year.

June at a Glance:

- 22,000 items were checked out (we only own 24,000).
- 13,581 people walked in our doors.
- Nearly 3,000 patron questions answered.
- Over 120 volunteer hours of service helping us to tutor and reshelve items.

If you'd like to volunteer to be a

part of all of this, we are still looking for someone to help gather donations for the summer reading programs next year.

Phase II: Redwood Road Widening Project

UDOT contractors have started construction of the the Continuous Flow Intersection (CFI). Pioneer Crossing traffic will be shifted to the outer lanes while crews work in the middle of the roadway.

Drivers can expect traffic shifts to be ongoing in this area and at the Riverside Drive and Pioneer Crossing intersection for the next four months.

Crews will also be installing utility pipes on Redwood Road between Lake View Terrace Road and Village Parkway. To minimize daytime traffic delays, work hours will be from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. seven nights a week and will last up to three weeks.

During work hours, Redwood Road will be reduced to one lane, and one-way flagging will be used to maintain north and southbound traffic. Residents can expect increased noise, vibrations and construction lighting. Daytime construction will continue as well but won't include lane closures.

The reconstruction of Stillwater Drive and Fairway Boulevard intersections continues. Drivers should obey speed limits and drive cautiously through

the designated detour. To minimize delays during the school year and to accelerate the schedule, the following closures and traffic changes are in place:

- **Stillwater Drive full closure:** Stillwater Drive is closed between Redwood Road and Summerhill Drive from July 9 to Aug. 6. There will be no access to and from Redwood Road at this intersection.
- **Fairway Boulevard (west leg) traffic changes:** The north side of Fairway Boulevard is closed between Redwood Road and Maverick Road. Access to and from Redwood Road will be maintained using the south side of Fairway Boulevard.
- **Fairway Boulevard (east leg) traffic changes:** Crews are installing a storm drain on the south side and traffic is being maintained on the north side. Next week, traffic will shift to the south side while crews install a storm drain on the north side.



2017 Drinking Water Quality Report

We're pleased to present to you this year's Annual Drinking Water Quality Report. This report is designed to inform you about the quality of the water and services we deliver to you every day. Our constant goal is to provide you with a safe and dependable supply of drinking water.

We want you to understand the efforts we make to continually improve the water treatment process and protect our water resources.

We are committed to ensuring the quality of your water. Our water sources have been determined to be from groundwater and surface water sources. Our water sources are District Well 1, Well #2, Well #3, Well #4, and Well #6. We also purchase water from Central Utah WCD-Utah Valley (25112).

The Drinking Water Source Protection Plan for Saratoga Springs is available

for your review. It contains information about source protection zones, potential contamination sources and management strategies to protect our drinking water. Our sources are located in remote and protected areas and have a low level of susceptibility to potential contamination sources.

We have also developed management strategies to further protect our sources from contamination. Please contact us if you have questions or concerns about our source protection plan.
