This year there were around 61,000 kids and 7,500 volunteers involved in Jr. Jazz across 6 states, which makes receiving these awards a great honor for all those involved.

The Jr. Jazz awards were presented to the winners at a sportsmanship event the Jazz hold each year after the completion of the season.

Dave Guymon was awarded the parent of the year award. "Dave was very helpful to me and my team of 1st-2nd grade girls. He spent every game on the bench while I was out refereeing. He helped with deciding who would sub in and out, took care of the team. All this without being officially asked to coach." (Dane Davis)

Brennan Bitter was awarded as the player of the year. "Brennen always focused on enjoying the game and his great love for basketball. He never said negative things to his teammates, another team's players or the referees." (Anonymous)

Ben Fuller was awarded as the coach of the year. "Ben Fuller should absolutely win this award! He was very patient with the kids and made learning the game fun. But most importantly he taught them how to be a good teammate and competitor." (Christie Espersen) In addition to this award Ben has been nominated by the Jazz for the All NBA Youth Coach of the Year. This award will be chosen later this year.

Finally Tyler Neeley, Recreation Coordinator responsible for organizing a lot of our Jr. Jazz program was awarded Jr. Jazz Director of the year.
