Careful In Our Landscaping

When landscaping or beautifying your yard with delivered materials, whether it's bark, sand, decorative rock, gravel, etc., those materials should never be dumped in any public right-of-way. The public right of-way includes streets, sidewalks, curbs and gutters.

Materials should always be dumped in your driveway or yard so that storm water does not carry it away and into the City's storm drain inlets. Not doing so can clog the inlets and prevent the storm water from properly draining, which may also cause flooding or overflow on the roads.

As a good reminder when purchasing materials to be delivered to your home, please take the time to prepare an area for the placement of the product. Also, make a plan to use it as quickly as possible so that it does not wash off your driveway and end up in the storm drain from rain or other weather.

Finally, please remember that storm water is not filtered, and that anything that runs down the gutters and streets eventually ends up in our rivers and lakes. Don't forget, "Only Rain Down The Drain" and please, let's leave it better than we found it.





Enjoying Fireworks Safely



The Community is Stronger When We Work Together

At the Saratoga Springs Police Department our primary mission is for all of our citizens to feel safe. We are dedicated to treating all persons with respect and dignity. Our officers' goal is to have a peaceful resolution to every situation.

This mission needs the support of the community. The success of our mission is as dependent on us, as it is on the support from the community. Below are measures that our police department is taking and ways that you can get involved.

POLICE DEPARTMENT EFFORTS

Our police department set the goal a few years ago to have every officer certified in a program called Crisis Intervention Techniques or C.I.T., which is nationally recognized as one of the most comprehensive de-escalation training programs available. It consists

of 40 hours of initial training and periodic follow-up trainings to maintain certification. It is geared toward dealing with mentally ill citizens, as well as those who are experiencing severe distress, anger and/or are exhibiting aggressive behavior.

In addition to this certification, we continually participate in ongoing trainings, which include:

- Use of Body Cameras
- Implicit Bias
- Crisis Intervention Techniques
- De-escalation Techniques
- Less-than Lethal Force
- Suicide Awareness & Mental Health Issues
- Professionalism and Ethics

HOW YOU CAN GET INVOLVED

Volunteers In Police Service

Saratoga Springs also offers a volunteer program called, Volunteers In Police Service (VIPS), which any resident may participate in. These volunteers complete a citizen's academy, provide service at events and other programs in our community, and oftentimes give valuable feedback to our department. We invite residents to participate in VIPS and the citizen's academy to gain a better understanding of the trainings and policies that our department undertakes.

Neighborhood Watch And School Programs

We have a Neighborhood Outreach program that includes Neighborhood Watch programs and child car seat clinics. We also have School Resource Officers at Westlake High School and both of the Middle Schools in Saratoga Springs.

Likewise, we work with the elementary schools to provide the D.A.R.E. program. We usually hold a National Night Out every August, as well as work with Communities That Care on prescription drug take backs and other programs.

Communities That Care

The City partners with Utah County and Eagle Mountain to offer the Communities That Care program. This program is youth focused. It invites individuals and community leaders to evaluate and implement ways to help our youth from all backgrounds to feel engaged and part of the community they live in. They are regularly looking for volunteers to help develop and drive initiatives that support all of our youth in the community.

2019 Drinking Water Quality Report

We're pleased to present to you this year's Annual Drinking Water Quality Report. This report is designed to inform you about the quality of the water and services we deliver to you every day. Our constant goal is to provide you with a safe and dependable supply of drinking water.

We want you to understand the efforts we make to continually improve the water treatment process and protect our water resources.

We are committed to ensuring the quality of your water. Our water sources have been determined to be from groundwater and surface water sources. Our water sources are District Well 1, Well #2, Well #3, Well #4, and Well #6. We also purchase water from Central Utah WCD-Utah Valley (25112).

The Drinking Water Source Protection Plan for Saratoga Springs is available for your

review. It contains information about source protection zones, potential contamination sources and management strategies to protect our drinking water. Our sources are located in remote and protected areas and have a low level of susceptibility to potential contamination sources.

We have also developed management strategies to further protect our sources from contamination. Please contact us if you have questions or concerns about our source protection plan.
