

DRIVE UP SERVICE

Have you used our drive up service? It is like pick up for groceries, but better because you are getting books to feed your mind. Drive up service is open anytime during our open hours.

It is easy to do if you follow the steps below:

1. Log in into your account through our catalog <https://sscity.bywatersolutions.com/>
2. Put books you are interested in on hold.
3. When the books are available you will get an email. When you get that email, you can come to library to pick them up.
4. When you arrive at the library, park in one of our 4 spots designated for pick up on the south side of the building.
5. Give us a call (801-766-6513) to let us know you have arrived. We will need to know your library card number and what spot you are parked in.
6. We bring your books out to your car and you are on your way.
