### BECOME A SARATOGA SPRINGS POLICE DEPARTMENT EXPLORER

The Saratoga Springs Police Department is proud to announce the formation of a new program for the youth of the city. The Utah National Parks Council, of the Boy Scouts of America, is chartering the all-new Police Explorer Post for the City's new police department.

Under the direction of Saratoga Springs Police Department Chief Gary Hicken, with appointed advisors Corporal Aaron Rosen and Officer Derek Johnson, this new Explorer Post is designed for youth between the ages of 14-19, and who are residents of Saratoga Springs. The purpose of the organization is to provide a positive experience and exposure to youth who may be interested in the field of Law Enforcement.



Explorers can expect to become involved in various activities, including training relative to Law Enforcement (i.e.-tactical training, firearms orientation, emergency vehicle operations, criminal law and procedure), also Explorers will assist Patrol Officers with various duties, such as: property checks, and traffic control. They will become a viable part of the SSPD Organization.

Students who are interested in joining the Post are required to maintain a 2.0 GPA, attend at least one meeting per month, be willing to assist in purchasing their equipment, and be of good moral character. Prospective applicants will be subjected to a background check prior to their appointment as a Saratoga Springs Police Explorer. MOUNTAIN VIEW CORRIDOR DRAFT  
ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT  
STATEMENT

**SALT LAKE CITY (Oct. 15, 2007)** – The Utah Department of Transportation announces the release of the Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) on the Mountain View Corridor, a proposed highway and transit corridor in west Salt Lake County and northwest Utah County. The public comment period for the DEIS is Oct. 17 through Dec. 24, 2007.

"Five volumes, 34 chapters, 2,200 pages and 18 pounds later, we have reached a significant milestone on the Mountain View Corridor with the release of the DEIS," said Teri Newell, Mountain View Corridor Project Manager. "This document offers comprehensive transportation solutions for areas of Salt Lake County and Utah County that are experiencing tremendous growth and congestion."

Comments may also be made at three public hearings: Hunter High School in West Valley City, Nov. 14, 4 – 8 p.m.; Willow Creek Middle School in Lehi, Nov. 15, 4 – 8 p.m.; and Copper Hills High School in West Jordan, Nov. 17, 2–6 p.m.

Tremendous growth is projected in west Salt Lake County and northwest Utah County over the next 30 years, including a 167 percent increase in population, a 298 percent increase in employment, and a 223 percent increase in households. This growth will cause significant delay on many of the major north-south and east-west roads in the project area. It will also create new demands for public transportation or transit service.

After nearly five years of extensive study, the project team has narrowed the list of viable transportation solutions to two roadway alternatives and two transit alternatives in Salt Lake County, three roadway alternatives in Utah County and a trail system. The Federal Highway Administration will ultimately make the final selection of a preferred alternative, which will be documented in the Record of Decision in 2008.
