CITY WELCOMES JUDGE

The City of Saratoga Springs is pleased to welcome the new Court Judge Keith L. Stoney. Keith is presently a Justice Court Judge for West Valley City. He has a Bachelor of Arts degree in Interpersonal Communication and a Juris Doctorate. In 1983, under his direction, West Valley City established the first coordinated domestic violence program in the State of Utah. His program and City ordinances were so successful that the

state of Utah modeled the program in its first domestic violence legislation in 1990. Judge Stoney has served as a former police officer, a certified court mediator, an erstwhile defense attorney, and a chief prosecutor. He has taught speech, debate and communication courses at Brigham Young University and criminal law at the J. Reuben Clark School of Law. The City is excited to have him here.

LEAKS CAN BE COSTLY


Did you know that the average household in Utah uses about 650 gallons of water per day? Half of that water is used in the home. Having a leak not only increases your water usage dramatically but can be costly. A toilet that runs continuously can use as much as 4,000 gallons of water per month. A faucet that drips slowly can use up to 5,000 per month. There are fixtures and connections inside and outside of your home that could be leaking and can go unnoticed for several months. Simple ways to check for leaks are: 1) Look for damp areas in your home or yard; 2) Listen for the sound of running water when no water is being used. Conserving water is good for the environment and it can mean lower water bills for you. Checking for leaks is a very important factor in conservation. Even the smallest leak that may take weeks to be noticed, can cause you to lose up to 120 gallons per day. With cold months

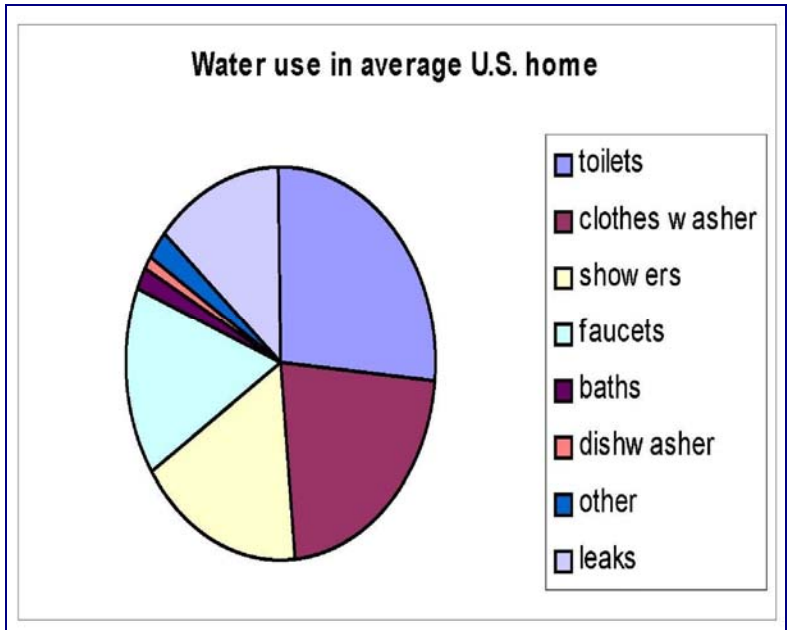

NORTH UTAH COUNTY EAST-WEST TRANSPORTATION STUDY PUBLIC WORKSHOPS

Mountainland Association of Governments (MAG) and the cities of Alpine, Lehi, Saratoga Springs, Eagle Mountain, American Fork, Highland, Cedar Hills, Pleasant Grove, Fairfield, Cedar Fort, Lindon, Vineyard, and Orem are conducting a study to identify east-west transportation solutions in the northern portion of Utah County. This study aims to connect communities, develop long-term corridor preservation strategies, support the local economy, retain our quality of life, and alleviate congestion through the year 2040.

PARK RESERVATIONS

Are you having a family reunion this summer or some other outdoor event and would like to reserve a pavilion in one of the City's parks? Residents can now reserve the Harvest Hills, Marina, and Sunrise Meadows pavilions. All you need to do to reserve one of these pavilions is come in to the City offices, pay the \$25.00 reservation fee, and sign a reservation agreement. Reservations can be made up to 6 months in advance and no less than 48 hours in advance. Pavilions can be reserved for a block of time. The morning block runs from 9:00 am to 2:00 pm and the evening block runs from 3:00 pm to 9:00 pm. Remember when using the pavilions to leave it in as good or better condition than you found it. Let's keep our parks clean and inviting.

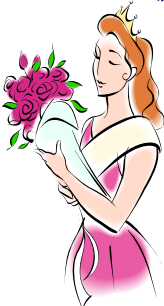
Family Week April 21-26, 2008
