CITY COUNCIL VACANCY

2009-2010 BUDGET

The City Council will be conducting a public hearing on the Fiscal Year 2009-2010 Tentative Budget on June 9, 2009 at 7:00 p.m. at the City Council Chambers. There is no property tax increase proposed in this budget, though some fee changes are proposed in the City's water and sewer rates. Copies of the Tentative Budget are available at the City offices or online at www.saratoga-springs.net.

City Councilman Jefferson Moss has resigned and will be ending his Council term effective June 23, 2009. He is currently serving a four year term which expires at the end of 2009. The City will be filling the remainder of Councilman Moss' term by appointment of the City Council. In order to be considered for this appointment, qualified applicants must submit a letter of interest by Wednesday, June 18, 2009 to Lori Yates, City Recorder. Qualified applicants must be US Citizens at least 18 years of age, be a registered voter, be current residents of the City of Saratoga Springs and must have resided in the City for at least twelve consecutive months immediately prior to serving on the City Council. The Council intends to conduct interviews of candidates and fill the vacancy at a special meeting at the City Offices on June 30, 2009 at 6:30 p.m.

LYNN CLAWSON DEFIBRILLATOR MEMORIAL FUND

The Lynn Clawson Defibrillator Memorial Fund has been established by some residents in the Saratoga Springs Development in order to raise donations for the purchase of portable defibrillator devices that can be carried in all of the City's police cars. On April 27, 2009, Mr. Lynn Clawson, a City resident, suffered a fatal heart attack at his home. Saratoga Springs Police units were the first to arrive and administered CPR prior to the arrival of ambulance and medical personnel. Police units did not have defibrillators for use in the case of Mr. Clawson's emergency. It is felt that having portable defibrillating devices as a part of the City's Police response may increase the chances of saving victims of heart attacks. These devices can be used by untrained personnel and are able to automatically give the necessary aid required in instances of heart attack. BUDGET TRANSFER

The City of Saratoga Springs has experienced dramatic revenue declines in the last twelve months. In order to maintain our current property tax rate and to balance the General Fund, the City intends to transfer up to \$370,000 from its water utility funds to the General Fund. This transfer was contemplated last year in the adoption of the current budget (ending June 30, 2009) and will not be made unless it is necessary to balance the General Fund.
