## Snow Removal Prioritization

During the winter months, the City's goal is to keep the streets safe for travel. The City is responsible for approximately 90 miles of road equating to about 180 miles of plowing. City crews conduct snow removal and road salting operations around the clock, if necessary, during winter storms. In order to achieve this, the City has a prioritized sequence in which the roads will be plowed and salted.

**Residents are asked to not park vehicles on roadways during or immediately after a snowstorm to allow snow plows to clear roadways.**

During severe storms, the Public Works Department may only get to the priority streets as those roads must remain as clear as possible. Second and third priority will get cleared, however it may take a couple days after a large storm to get to them. It is also not the position of the City of Saratoga Springs to maintain a bare pavement policy on every street after a snowstorm given the many other duties of the Public Works Department.

## Help Keep Storm Water Clean

**Cleaning your home carpets after the holidays? If you clean your own carpets, rugs or upholstery, follow these steps:**

- 1. Remove the wastewater collection container from the carpet cleaner following the manufacturer's instructions.**
- 2. Separate the liquid wastewater from the solid waste particles in the wastewater using a strainer. Solid waste particles, such as hair, can clog drains. Use a bucket to collect the liquid as it goes through the strainer.**
- 3. Dispose of the wastewater collected in the bucket in the toilet, sink or a floor drain. These drains lead to the wastewater treatment plant, which filters the wastewater to remove the chemicals.**
- 4. Rinse the bucket, strainer and wastewater collection container using clean water. Dispose of this water in the same manner you disposed of the wastewater.**

**Never dispose of carpet cleaning water by pouring it on the ground or into a storm drain. If you throw the water away using one of those methods, the chemicals in the water will eventually drain off into the delicate ecosystem.**

### GUIDELINES TO ENSURE CONSISTENT SERVICE

- If a holiday (only those shown above on calendar) falls on a weekday, service will be delayed one day following the holiday.
- Recycle containers that are contaminated with trash in them will **NOT** be dumped.
- All containers **MUST** be placed outside at the curb by **7:00 a.m.**
- Containers should be placed in the street with the wheels against the curb or within **2 feet** of blacktop with the front of the container facing the street
- Containers must be placed **4 feet** apart from other containers and **8 feet** from mailboxes, poles, fences, trees, or parked vehicles for easy access.
- Please **break-down** cardboard boxes
